Questions for Personal Reflection and Group Discussion

esus knew that His physical presence with His precious disciples would soon end. He also knew that these men would need a clear understanding of their position with God, as well as what was expected of them. So He consciously filled their minds with pictures and ideas to help them survive the days to come. But these same lessons also provide vital resources for preparing future generations of disciples — you and those you minister to — to grow in their faith.

Prayerfully read the following Scripture passage. Ask the Holy Spirit to illuminate the words of our Lord and Savior as you seek to learn and apply His teaching to your new life in Christ. Then answer the questions as a means to write His word in your heart.

John 15:1-16 NKJV

Jesus said: "I am the true vine, and My Father is the vinedresser.

²Every branch in Me that does not bear fruit He takes away; and every branch that bears fruit He prunes, that it may bear more fruit.

³You are already clean because of the word which I have spoken to you.

⁴ bide in Me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in Me.

⁵"I am the vine, you are the branches. He who abides in Me, and I in him, bears much fruit; for without Me you can do nothing.

⁶If anyone does not abide in Me, he is cast out as a branch and is withered; and they gather them and throw them into the fire, and they are burned.

⁷If you abide in Me, and My words abide in you, you will ask what you desire, and it shall be done for you.

⁸By this My Father is glorified, that you bear much fruit; so you will be My disciples.

9As the Father loved Me, I also have loved you; abide in My love.

10If you keep My commandments, you will abide in My love,
just as I have kept My Father's commandments and abide in His love.

11These things I have spoken to you, that My joy may remain in you, and that your joy may be full.

12This is My commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you.

13Greater love has no one than this, than to lay down one's life for his friends.

14You are My friends if you do whatever I command you.

15No longer do I call you servants, for a servant does not know what his master is doing; but I have called you friends, for all things that I heard from My Father I have made known to you.

16You did not choose Me, but I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit, and that your fruit should remain, that whatever you ask the Father in My name He may give you."
