"Guard the Truth"

HEART ATTITUDE: Living for the King

Are you on the side of truth? Do you listen to your King? Is there a greater privilege in life than to be entrusted with the Truth?

Paul concludes his first letter to Timothy with the charge "to keep this command" This may refer to the commands Christ gave His disciples, or to Timothy's promise to serve Christ. Paul compared Timothy's confession of faith to Christ's before Pilate: "In fact, for this reason I was born, and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone on the side of truth listens to Me" (John 18:37, NIV).

¹⁷Command those who are rich in this present world not to be arrogant nor to put their hope in wealth, which is so uncertain, but to put their hope in God,

who richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment. (17)

¹⁸Command them to do good, to be rich in good deeds, and to be generous and willing to share. (18)

¹⁹In this way they will lay up treasure for themselves as a firm foundation for the coming age,

so that they may take hold of the life that is truly life. (19)

²⁰Timothy, guard what has been entrusted to your care.

Turn away from godless chatter and the opposing ideas of what is falsely called knowledge, (20)

²¹Which some have professed and in so doing have wandered from the faith. Grace be with you. (21)

Even if we don't have material wealth, we can be rich in good works toward others. No matter how poor we are, we have something to share with everyone — the Gospel!
