### Kurnool District Flood Relief October, 2009

Pastor John Pendleton’s ministry, “Reaching the Unreached” (RTU), donated \$700.00 in the name of “The Most Excellent Way” to provide families with relief in the village where TMEW meetings are held.

### The Most Excellent Way Ministry Kurnool Division Flood Relief Program

“Whenever you did it for any of my people,  
no matter how unimportant they seemed,  
you did it for Me.”

“The Most Excellent Way” ministry is involved in flood relief program in Kurnool town on 19th October 2009 — to share our concern with the affected people. In recent floods on October 1 and 2 in Kurnool town and villages.



The condition of town itself is miserable — roads are filled with dust, silt, stagnation of water spread of bad smell, contamination of water and food items. The team visited heavy hit areas, almost all the residents are vacated their houses, leaving household articles and food grains.

We have tried to go further deep into flood area to visit residences still covered with mud water and silt, but it is very difficult to reach there. In the



beginning it was planned to distribute relief to 15 neediest people, but after seeing the condition, 11 more people were added. The help is distributed equally to them by perfectly planning to avoid duplication of relief material.

TMEW ministry’s relief distribution is helped by the local leaders and newly joined team members



notably, Dr. Francis, lecturer in economics and his wife, Mrs. Nalni; Mr. Maddileti and his wife, Mrs. Indira; and small group leaders from paper mill colony, Mr. Swamidas and David; and also my wife, Mrs. Suhasini.

The program was started with prayer and introduction about TMEW and its generous help to the flood affected people. The relief distribution is covered in local newspapers next day – the news came in all major Telugu papers – and also telecasted in local TV news.

Physically weak, disabled and aged people – around 12 people – still are seeking relief. It is very difficult for them to come to relief points unless somebody to visit them at their places to provide relief. They need urgent relief.

The items provided were blankets, towels, dhotti (long loincloth worn by Hindu men), saris (for women), mats and cooking utensils.



I am thankful to “Reaching the Unreached”, for supporting the flood victims in Kurnool town. TMEW Kurnool shares its concern with people who lost everything and give confidence. ■
