TMEW groups in Angelina County had the great honor of hosting the Leadership Conference & Training Workshops on May 11-12, 2012 in Lufkin, TX. It was so good to see our friends and ministry mentors once again, and for most, to meet them for the first time.

The conference was held at Trinity Baptist Church, where the first ever TMEW meeting in Texas began back in September 2001. We're grateful to Trinity's MEW leader, Jim Heberling for setting up and keeping things running smoothly, and Pastor Walter Futch for providing the conference room.

Two days of great teaching, learning and fellowship began with Pastor Glenn Wright speaking to us about ministering God's way versus ministering man's way.

Pastor Paul Graves from Montana gave a fantastic presentation on what discipleship really is. We find that answer in how Jesus taught His disciples and built them up. He explained to us what sitting under a Jewish Rabbi meant in those days, and told us about the TALID – the Jewish prayer shawl and all the meanings every knot, fiber and color hold.

Pastor Lu Wing presented "Cleansing the Addicted Mind-Body-Soul God's Way." There is no way I can explain everything he talked about, but I learned what it really means to be pronounced clean by the Almighty God!

Pastor Ed Day of Horizon Christian Fellowship in San Diego followed with his points on ministering to the Family and Friends of those suffering from addiction, the crux of which is that we also point them toward a daily walk with Christ to be able to deal with what is going on with their beloved family member or friend, rather than focusing on all the problems that have been created by the dependent.

Saturday morning we gathered together again and **Pastor Lu Wing** brought us a beautiful picture of forgiveness by expounding on the Greek and Hebrew root words and explaining sacrifices of Old Testament days from Leviticus. I think I sat there with my mouth open the whole time, marveling at the realization of what Jesus Christ has truly done for us in His obedience to the Father and taking on our sin, allowing us to be heirs with Him eternally.

The next workshop "Looking Beyond the Meeting" was presented by **Pastor Rick McClung** TMEW Director at First Baptist Church in Panama City, FL. He and his wife Vickie have an amazing and extensive ministry of TMEW in their area. Eighteen MEW meetings and some prayer meetings going on in and outside their church in detox centers, jails, etc. (if I counted correctly). It was mind blowing and spirit lifting to see how God's hand has blessed so many people through their faithful service. Their successful plan has evolved through much prayer, making sure they were staying within God's will, always being prepared, taking the time to promote and advertise their meetings and of course – enduring and persevering through and in the Word of God!

My presentation on "Is God's Word All We Really Need?" came next. I cannot tell you how honored I was to be asked to speak on this topic. The world is so lost in the midst of the wisdom and customs of man, even so called believers have found themselves confused as to whether God's Word really is all we need to live whole and completely healed lives. We are all called to be ministers of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, raising up disciples. If we say we believe the Word of God to be "inspired by God and profitable for teaching, reproof, correction and training in righteousness, that the man of God may be adequate, equipped for every good work" (II Tim-othy 3:16-17), then why are we paying someone to be our friend and give worldly advice to us and our families inside the walls of counseling offices all over the country?

Ministry leaders have introduced TMEW to local judges, clerks and probation officers who have added TMEW to their referral lists.
