- **Child Safety** — As you prepare to minister to children in “The Most Excellent Way,” we recommend that you speak with your pastor or appropriate elder to learn about the child welfare laws in your state, and the policies of your church. For instance, in [California](http://California.gov), if a teacher discovers a child is being physically or sexually abused, the State requires that this information be reported to the Child Welfare Department to protect the children. Churches and ministries are *not* exempted from this law.

Enclosed is a Ministry Team Application which should be completed by everyone who desires to minister to children, for their protection and for the children’s protection. We strongly recommend this form be photocopied, completed by each teacher, and given to your church’s administrator for safekeeping *before* the first Children’s Meeting.
