


MISSION STATEMENT

“Reaching the Unreached” Ministry is a non-profit organization dedicated to sharing the Gospel message of Jesus Christ with poor and persecuted Christians in India and Nepal.



REACHING THE UNREACHED PROGRAMS

Poverty in India results in many children between the ages of 5 and 12 living on the streets and providing for themselves as best they can. They are referred to as “rag-pickers”. We are involved with a church that provides shelter for these street children in Bangalore.

They receive a clean living area, proper food, schooling, and training in social skills and hygiene. This enables them to rest, play, and remain clean. They are introduced to the Gospel of Jesus Christ, which gives them hope, and a future. At present the orphanage contains 18 girls and 24 boys being cared for in 2 separate centers. Alcoholism and drug abuse is very serious in India and Nepal, even among “rag-picker” street children. “The Most Excellent Way” God-centered rehabilitation program has been introduced to three cities in India, and has been met with enthusiasm.

A pastor’s conference is scheduled in Katmandu, Nepal, to introduce the program there. Most Indian pastors have had limited formal schooling. We conduct pastor-training conferences, with pastors coming from many remote areas. In Bangalore, we support a ministry to Eunuchs that is led by an Indian pastor and his wife. Eunuchs are shunned by Indian society due to their deviant life-style. This is a very difficult ministry, but gradually, some of them have accepted Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior.

THE RAGPICKER CHILD

What do you see when you’re looking at me,
My clothes are all tatters,
My hair full of fleas.

OUR ACTIVITIES

The organization pursues five main activities:

1. Provides financial support to meet the needs of three small churches.
2. Provides audio, written, and visual Bible-study material in various native languages.
3. Conducts Pastor-training leadership conferences.
4. Conducts Bible-training seminars and teachings in the Gospel of Jesus Christ.
5. Provides leadership training in "The Most Excellent Way" drug and alcohol (substance-abuse) rehabilitation program.

OUR VISION

Our vision is to share the gospel of Christ with people of India and Nepal, helping them to realize their need for a personal relationship with God through belief in Jesus Christ.

OUR PURPOSE

Our purpose is to share the gospel with those who do not know Jesus; to equip believers to live Christian lives; and to impact families and communities through "The Most Excellent Way", a God-based substance abuse recovery program.

We believe that sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ is one of the most important things that we as Christians have been called to do.

OUR PASSION

Pastor John and Cindy Pendleton have been serving India for 5 years. We have developed many close ties with Indian Christians and find them to be loving brothers and sisters-in-the-LORD.

Cindy conducted a three-day seminar in Bangalore, India, covering the topic of "The Power of a Praying Wife". Over 400 women came to this Christian seminar, many of them Hindu and Muslim.

Pastor John has visited India numerous times and plans to return to India and to Katmandu, Nepal in the fall

We have a tremendous passion for sharing the message of God's love with the people there.



INDIA'S POPULATION GROWTH

There are about 45,000 babies born in India every day. The population of India is nearly 1.5 Billion. India is expected to become the most populated country on earth soon. Only 5 percent of Indians know anything about Jesus Christ. For an example, in the Southern state of Tamil Nadu, about 4.5 million people die every year, which means that 1,200 people die every day without knowing Jesus Christ as their Savior.
